The Bloomberg Harvard City Leadership Initiative promotes bold mayoral leadership and innovative governance in cities around the world.

The Bloomberg Harvard City Leadership Initiative, a collaboration among Bloomberg Philanthropies, Harvard Kennedy School, and Harvard Business School, aspires to equip city leaders with the ideas, tools, and techniques needed to solve urban challenges, deliver exceptional results for their residents, and advance a culture of high performance and innovation.

A select group of up to 40 mayors will be chosen to participate in the inaugural year-long learning program.

The initiative kicks off with an in-person Executive Education session in New York City from July 16 to July 19, 2017.
